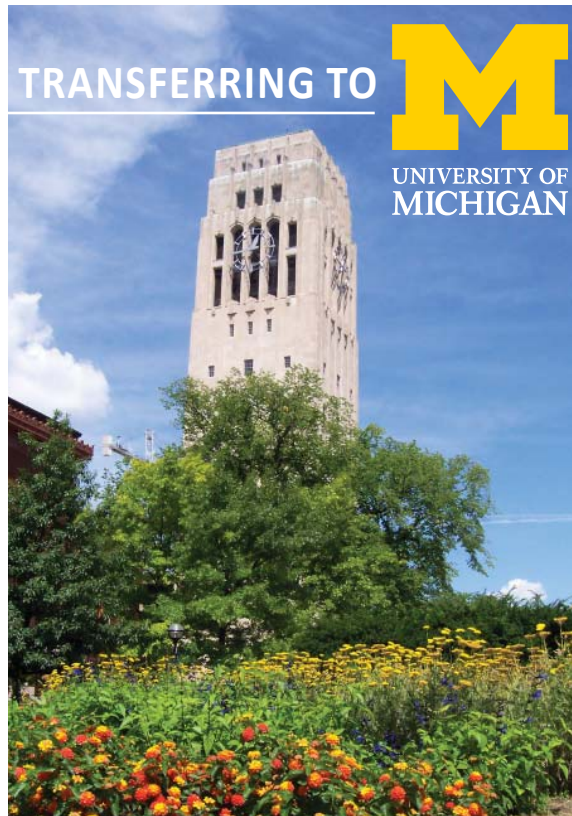

**A NEW WORLD OF OPPORTUNITIES**

Transferring to U-M can be a big decision and there are many factors to consider, including cost and the financial assistance you receive.

If you are a resident student, your financial aid award at U-M will cover your college expenses, less what you and your parents are expected to contribute.

For students living outside of Michigan, other resources such as private scholarships or loans may be necessary to supplement aid from U-M. Our office can help you find these resources, understand financial aid programs and assist with budgeting.

- Apply for financial aid as soon as possible. You don't have to be accepted to U-M before applying.
- You can receive aid each year, but must reapply annually.
- Your financial aid is likely to be similar each year if your family circumstances and available U-M funds do not change.
- Aid is awarded on a rolling, first-come, first-served basis, so be sure to apply by deadline, especially to be considered for grants!

*The long-term value of a degree from a reputable institution is a key consideration along with cost.*

- ✓ complete and submit the 2016-2017 CSS/PROFILE to be considered for U-M grants (use CSS code 1839) [student.collegeboard.org/css-financial-aid-profile](http://student.collegeboard.org/css-financial-aid-profile)

(The PROFILE is not available after mid-January.)

IF APPLYING FOR **FALL TERM 2017:**

**October 2016 – February 2017**

## WHAT ARE THE TYPES OF AID?

### GRANTS:

Funds that are not repaid, based on financial need

### LOANS:

Funds that must be repaid, with interest, when you are no longer a student

### SCHOLARSHIPS:

Funds that are not repaid. Entering students are considered for most U-M scholarships; some are based on need, while others reflect U-M's commitment to a student body diverse in experience, geography, special talents and academic achievement.

- Two scholarships are offered to eligible, entering transfer students from Michigan community colleges. Apply for financial aid to be considered:

### WORK-STUDY EMPLOYMENT:

Wages earned through part-time employment up to the amount awarded. You receive a paycheck and apply it toward your college expenses. There are also non Work-Study opportunities both on and off campus.

### CHILD CARE SUBSIDY:

Funds for students with children to help them pay for licensed, Michigan-based child care.

## WHAT IS NEED-BASED AID AND CAN I GET IT?

We review student and family finances to determine if they have need.

- **COST OF ATTENDANCE** refers to the estimated cost of attending U-M for Fall and Winter **semesters**.
- **EXPECTED FAMILY CONTRIBUTION (EFC)\***, the amount that a student and family are expected to pay toward your educational expenses.

Here is how we calculate need:

<b>COST OF ATTENDANCE</b> (Budget)
— Expected Family Contribution (EFC)
— Other Aid or Resources (such as private scholarships)
= <b>Your Need for Aid</b>

\*U-M uses information from the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and the CSS/Financial Aid PROFILE to determine your EFC. The FAFSA determines eligibility for federal and state aid and the PROFILE eligibility for need-based university grants and scholarships.

## YOUR AWARD NOTIFICATION

You will receive an email notifying you when an Award Notice is available on Wolverine Access listing the aid you are eligible to receive for the coming year. Wolverine Access is a secure portal for your U-M student information. Students are notified on a rolling basis, after applying for financial aid and once they are admitted to U-M.
